Great Ideas GRANT Program



What is the Great Ideas Grant Program?

The Great Ideas Grant Program is a cornerstone of the Plentywood Education & Alumni Foundation's mission to enrich education in the Plentywood Public Schools. It is designed to put money directly into the hands of classroom teachers, helping educators take ideas for innovative

teaching strategies and make them a reality. Specific goals include:

- Providing funds for projects to enhance student learning that would otherwise not be possible within the District budget or with any other
- Generating creative approaches and distribute resources to the School District to enrich, maintain and expand programs needed to meet the District's stated mission of excellence in education.

Who is Eligible?

All full or part-time teachers employed by the Plentywood School District are eligible to apply for Great Ideas Grants. Support personnel, students, parents, administrators and community members are encouraged to partner with teachers, though they may not submit a grant as the primary applicant. Applicants may apply as individuals or as part of a group. Educators within specific grades as well as across grade levels, subjects and schools are encouraged to collaborate. There is no limit to the number of applications that may be submitted by individuals or groups. See pg 4 for recipients.



"GET FIT" SHERIDAN COUNTY

In our own backyard we started an ongoing program 'Get Fit' called Sheridan County (similar to Shape Up Montana), a team concept where members convert miles walked, biked and other aero-

bic sports into points. In spite of being one of the most remote counties in the state and sparsest population, 82 people signed up and have completed Phase I of the program and are now midway through Phase II. The key is the team concept which provides support and motivation.

This is also a fundraiser for the Plentywood Education & Alumni Foundation. Adding an element of excitement is that several merchants have sponsored teams, including Groves Furniture whose team members consist of a group of ladies from the Pioneer Manor!
